And that is indeed the case. This is the

46

database that you would have to come

47

into the library to search. So for today

48

though if you would flip over to the tab

that says Foundation Grants Individuals

Online, this is where you can access the

database. And hopefully you are seeing a

a search. So you are always welcome to

prefer to use the advanced search.

57

Because I think it gives you a little

58

bit more control over what you get. Now

59

with this database it prefers for you to

60

use their terminology when searching and

61

00:03:14,533 --> 00:03:17,866

you can get to that terminology by

62

00:03:17,866 --> 00:03:20,966

clicking on "View Index" that's underneath

63

00:03:20,966 --> 00:03:22,966

the element that you're going to search.

64

00:03:22,966 --> 00:03:25,500

and generally what you want to do is

65

00:03:25,500 --> 00:03:27,866

search "Field of Interest" which is your

66

00:03:27,866 --> 00:03:31,200

subject area. And you probably will want

67

to use "Type of Support". So let me just

68

demonstrate that and mention too that I

69

gave you a blue sheet that kind of walks

70

you through step by step of what you

71

need to do in this database and how to

72

get to it. So I'm going to click on "View

73

00:03:52,833 --> 00:03:55,300

Index" for "Fields of Interest" which is

74

subject area. And you'll see that it

75

opened up on the left-hand side now an

76

alphabetical list of search terms.

This is where you get to hunt for your

78

terms. I'm going to try sociology to see

79

what I can find. And one thing I would do

80

is encourage you try to take your topic

81

of your research and translate it very

82

broadly. It is possible to put in some

very narrow specific searches but most

84

times you do you get better

85

00:04:33,600 --> 00:04:37,800

if you're searching say at the level of

86

00:04:37,800 --> 00:04:40,133

the name of your discipline for example.

87

And then sometimes you have to go even

88

more broadly. Like I did sociology but I

89

might need to also do social sciences.

90

So I just clicked on those two

91

terms and it popped them in the search

92

box and it put an "OR" in between. Which

93

is exactly what I want. Now I want to go

94

down to "Type of Support" and I'm going to

95

click on "View Index" and then I can see

the types of support that are available

for searching in this database. If I

98

were say an undergraduate student

I would not initially specify geographic

focus I would leave that off. And search...

And then you'll see it's giving me nine

109

opportunities and this is really only

110

one possible search. Really be creative

111

topic. And you know if I were working in

the field of sociology you know I might

might be in the related disciplines of

Sometimes you even have to go as broad

118

as higher education because yeah that's

prepared in this database to kind of

hunt around a bit. I'm going to now just

123

click on the "J Paul Getty Trust" and open

124

it up so you can see what a sample

125

record looks like. First of all note

126

it's giving you the direct link to the

127

website. This is one that has a

website. It's giving you no it's not

129

giving you a contact person. But it's

130

letting you also email the record to

options. It's giving you some background

because they assume that museum

you have it. But I'll keep reading and

153

one of the things I want to point out

154

you'll see that they have several

different program areas and you'll need

156

programs pertains to your needs. They can

159

their library, they give funds for you to

be a guest scholar, etc. Then you'll see

165

they have some multicultural

166

00:08:47,866 --> 00:08:50,366

undergraduate internships, so there's a

167

00:08:50,366 --> 00:08:54,333

quite a few things here. And then if this

168

were one that you were interested in you

169

00:08:57,966 --> 00:09:00,333

add it to your list of potential funding

170

places and then move on and identify

171

00:09:03,233 --> 00:09:05,633

some more and then you would come back

172

00:09:05,633 --> 00:09:09,366

and do a little bit more research on

173

this area. A couple of tips just to go

174

back to the main search. Try playing

175

around with different types of searches.

176

So I did "Fields of Interest" and "Type of

177

00:09:23,500 --> 00:09:28,033

Support". You can also try just doing a

178

00:09:28,033 --> 00:09:30,233

search on "Type of Support". Like if you're

179

00:09:30,233 --> 00:09:32,033

looking for dissertation support I

180

00:09:32,033 --> 00:09:34,933

believe that's a category. And then once

181

00:09:34,933 --> 00:09:38,166

you get results back you can use filters

182

00:09:38,166 --> 00:09:40,566

that you get on the left-hand side of

183

00:09:40,566 --> 00:09:44,500

the screen to narrow your search. If you

184

00:09:44,500 --> 00:09:48,366

are looking for funding to attend a

185

00:09:48,366 --> 00:09:51,366

particular school you can also use the

186

00:09:51,366 --> 00:09:55,300

"School Name Index" and see if you know

187

00:09:55,300 --> 00:09:57,700

the school that you are applying to

188

00:09:57,700 --> 00:10:01,366

comes up there. And you're also welcome

189

00:10:01,366 --> 00:10:05,600

to try your own keywords. So if you want

190

00:10:05,600 --> 00:10:07,300

to see if there's anything in here that

191

mentions a very specific field of study

192

that would be the place to put it in and

193

see if it comes up. But generally I would

194

encourage you try to think broadly, okay?

That's the most important thing here. Try

to take your topic and think of what

outside of the Foundation Directory by

downloading them to an Excel spreadsheet

222

or saving the descriptions as PDFs but

223

you can't save it in the database. That's

224

00:12:01,733 --> 00:12:04,266

for individual subscribers only. So just

225

cross out number 11 and number 12 on

226

00:12:09,066 --> 00:12:13,533

those steps. They just don't pertain.

227

Everything else should work and

228

00:12:17,566 --> 00:12:21,233

hopefully you have this big search box

229

on your screen. And what this database is

230

your own language about your research

Sometimes it works sometimes it doesn't.

recommendation. Because I think COS

240

Pivot does a much better job of giving

241
00:13:00,266 --> 00:13:04,066
you federal funders. But for now I'll

242
00:13:04,066 --> 00:13:06,200
leave it in here so that if I can see a

243
00:13:06,200 --> 00:13:08,800
record I'll show you what it looks like.

244

But in general I would say take those

245
00:13:12,266 --> 00:13:15,166
out of your search. So let's suppose that

246

I am interested in looking at a project

247

dealing with slavery in the U.S. So I

248
00:13:27,400 --> 00:13:30,666
might do something, again trying to put

249
00:13:30,666 --> 00:13:34,200
it in my own language. "history of slavery

250
00:13:34,200 --> 00:13:38,333
in the United States". But you'll notice

251

00:13:38,333 --> 00:13:41,333
that it took my terms and it translated

252
00:13:41,333 --> 00:13:45,466
it to: Black studies, History, in the

253
00:13:45,466 --> 00:13:49,766
United States. So that's pretty good. Not

254
00:13:49,766 --> 00:13:53,733
so bad. It's giving me 1,900 funders

255
00:13:53,733 --> 00:13:56,733
though. So that's that's a lot. I don't

256
00:13:56,733 --> 00:13:58,066
think I want to look through that many.

257
00:13:58,066 --> 00:14:03,500
So I'm going to filter this. And you'll

258
00:14:03,500 --> 00:14:05,700
see there's an option for Advanced

259
00:14:05,700 --> 00:14:08,933
Search and Filters. You're going to use

260
00:14:08,933 --> 00:14:11,900
that. And that's also where you can

261
00:14:11,900 --> 00:14:14,500
correct the language. So if it brings

262
00:14:14,500 --> 00:14:16,966
back a topic that doesn't look at all

263

00:14:16,966 --> 00:14:20,133
like what you wanted you're going to go

264
00:14:20,133 --> 00:14:22,700
in and change it. And you have the

265
00:14:22,700 --> 00:14:26,000
opportunity to correct here. So you see

266
00:14:26,000 --> 00:14:28,233
it's actually giving me general history

267
00:14:28,233 --> 00:14:31,233
and it's also giving me black studies.

268

One possible way for me to fix this

269
00:14:35,000 --> 00:14:38,666
search, because I had 1900, is maybe I can

270
00:14:38,666 --> 00:14:41,033
look at Black Studies first and see what

271

happens. In which case I would just click

272
00:14:43,166 --> 00:14:48,833
the "X" off of History and take it out. But

273
00:14:48,833 --> 00:14:50,600
for now I'll just go ahead and leave

274
00:14:50,600 --> 00:14:53,900
history in. I'll just put it back in. And

275

you see in this one when you start

276
00:14:55,833 --> 00:14:59,666
typing it suggests terms for you and it

277
00:14:59,666 --> 00:15:01,900
also gives you a hierarchy that you can

278
00:15:01,900 --> 00:15:06,500
use. So I'll leave those two in. Population

279

served is another way to winnow your

280
00:15:09,000 --> 00:15:09,733
search.

And I selected a population that I

282

thought might interest the rest of you

283

as well.

284

Academics. That's who's going to benefit

285
00:15:21,200 --> 00:15:23,666
from this project. There are additional

286
00:15:23,666 --> 00:15:27,500
filters too, and if I need to I can add

287

00:15:27,500 --> 00:15:31,333

some of those additional filters. Like in

288

00:15:31,333 --> 00:15:33,500

the other project I mean in the other

289

00:15:33,500 --> 00:15:35,600

database they use the term "Type of

290

00:15:35,600 --> 00:15:39,200

Support" this database does the same kind

291

00:15:39,200 --> 00:15:41,333

of search but it calls it "Support

292

00:15:41,333 --> 00:15:44,866

Strategy". So maybe I want to add research

293

00:15:44,866 --> 00:15:47,400

here. Again, because I'm trying to winnow

294

00:15:47,400 --> 00:15:49,533

my search down. I'm not trying to look at

295

00:15:49,533 --> 00:15:52,900

1900. So I'm going to put "research" in

296

00:15:52,900 --> 00:15:56,366

here. And now I'm ready to go ahead and

297

00:15:56,366 --> 00:15:58,300

search. And you'll notice there's also

298

00:15:58,300 --> 00:16:01,166

Geographic focus. That could also be

299

00:16:01,166 --> 00:16:03,700

another way that I tried to winnow my

300

00:16:03,700 --> 00:16:06,533

search down. You can try Delaware I've

301

00:16:06,533 --> 00:16:08,666

noticed that Delaware tends not to bring

302

00:16:08,666 --> 00:16:10,666

back very much. You can try Delaware

303

00:16:10,666 --> 00:16:14,366

Valley. You can also try, believe it or

304

00:16:14,366 --> 00:16:17,600

not, they have us in the South. The South

305

00:16:17,600 --> 00:16:22,633

Atlantic region so yeah all of those but

306
