**Genealogy for Beginners** presents an overview of the types of records that contain genealogical information as well as research strategies for finding and recording this data. Searching the online database *Ancestry Library Edition* for U.S. census records is included.

Research Funding Online focuses upon two Library databases, Foundation Directory Online and COS Funding Opportunities, which faculty, staff and graduate students can use to identify potential funding resources.
