Adobe Illustrator: The Basics is a very popular and robust program for those interested in graphic design. Since the art produced in Illustrator is vector-based, it is perfect for logos, typography and digital illustration. This workshop is for those with little or no experience with Illustrator who want to learn the basics.

Adobe Photoshop: Advanced Masking Techniques introduces participants to sophisticated workflows using Photoshop's layer masks, quick masks, channels and paths. These methods are used for a variety of artistic and practical effects. This workshop will start at an advanced level; it is recommended that participants take some of our other Photoshop workshops first or have previous experience with Photoshop.
