Student Multimedia Design Center

The Center includes over 80 computers with general and specialized software, 6 studios and 2 hands-on instruction rooms (Room A and Room B) and is designed for UD students, faculty and staff to work individually or in groups on the creation of multimedia, including digital video. Video cameras, hard drives, light kits, audio kits, laptops, iPads and more are available for loan from the service desk.



LIBRARY RESOURCES

The University of Delaware Library provides access to a wide variety of electronic resources throughout the Morris Library and the branch libraries. Most of these electronic resources are also available to University students, faculty and staff via the University computing network in residence halls, classrooms, offices and at home. Wireless access is available throughout the Morris Library to University students, faculty and staff.

DELCAT Discovery

DELCAT Discovery provides information about and access to the physical and electronic holdings of the University of Delaware Library. DELCAT Discovery provides links to electronic journals, electronic books and other resources. Students can limit searches to only those items physically held by the Library or a search can be done of the entire WorldCat database that encompasses millions of titles in libraries throughout the world. Items held by the University of Delaware Library appear at or near the top of the results display. Items not held by the Library can be requested via a link that automatically generates an interlibrary loan request form.

Databases

The Library subscribes to more than 370 electronic databases which provide the full text of thousands of articles as well as thousands of streaming videos and streaming audio to University of Delaware students, faculty and staff. Many databases provide the full text of historical documents and other resources for research.

Study Areas

Study areas are available throughout the Morris Library. The Reading Room and Reference Room on the First Floor and the Melva B. Guthrie Atrium on the Second Floor are popular choices for quiet study. All public study areas have wireless access. Individual and group study tables are located on all floors. The Information Room on the First Floor and Student Multimedia Design Center on the Lower Level provide spaces for collaboration.

LIBRARY SERVICES

Reference/Information Services

The Reference Desk on the First Floor of the Morris Library is staffed by professional librarians who assist users with database searching and with locating library resources to further their research.

Library Instruction

Librarians collaborate with faculty and instructors to enhance students' ability to critically and ethically use information. Popular library instruction offerings include instruction related to resources for particular courses or disciplines, general orientations to the library, and library workshops about specific resources. Librarians are also available to assist in the creation and support of multimedia assignments through the Multimedia Literacy program. Circulation - Borrowing Materials

Books, maps and microforms are checked out at the Circulation and Reserve Desk on the First Floor of the Morris Library. VHS/DVDs may be checked out from the Film and Video Desk and multimedia equipment from the Student Multimedia Design Center, both on the Lower Level of the Morris Library. All borrowers must present a valid UD ID or borrower card when borrowing library materials. The Lost and Found is also located at the Circulation and Reserve Desk. www.library.udel.edu/circulation

Scan, Print & Copy Services

Scanners are located on the First Floor and in the Student Multimedia Design Center on the Lower Level. There is no charge for scanning materials on scanners.

Photocopiers are located throughout the Morris Library. Self-service black and white photocopies and color copies are available for a fee.

Printing from Library computers is available for a fee. Single-sided black and white printouts and double-sided printouts are available as well as color pages. Computers on the First Floor are available to all users. Computers in the Student Multimedia Design Center on the Lower Level are available only to University of Delaware students, faculty and staff. guides.lib.udel.edu/printcopyscan

Pay for self-service photocopies or library computer printing using a University of Delaware ID card (i-card). Non-UD users may purchase a Library Copy Card at the Value Transfer Station on the First Floor or the Student Multimedia Design Center on the Lower Level. Users may add funds to University of Delaware ID cards (i-cards) and to Library Copy Cards at the Value Transfer Station or at the Student Multimedia Design Center.

Special Collections Department

The Special Collections Department located on the Second Floor includes rare books, manuscripts, archival department collections and other materials requiring special care and preservation. These materials do not circulate and must be used in the Special Collections Reading Room. Exhibitions in the gallery change several times during the year. The Lincoln Collection is on permanent rotating exhibit.
