About Anne M. Boylan

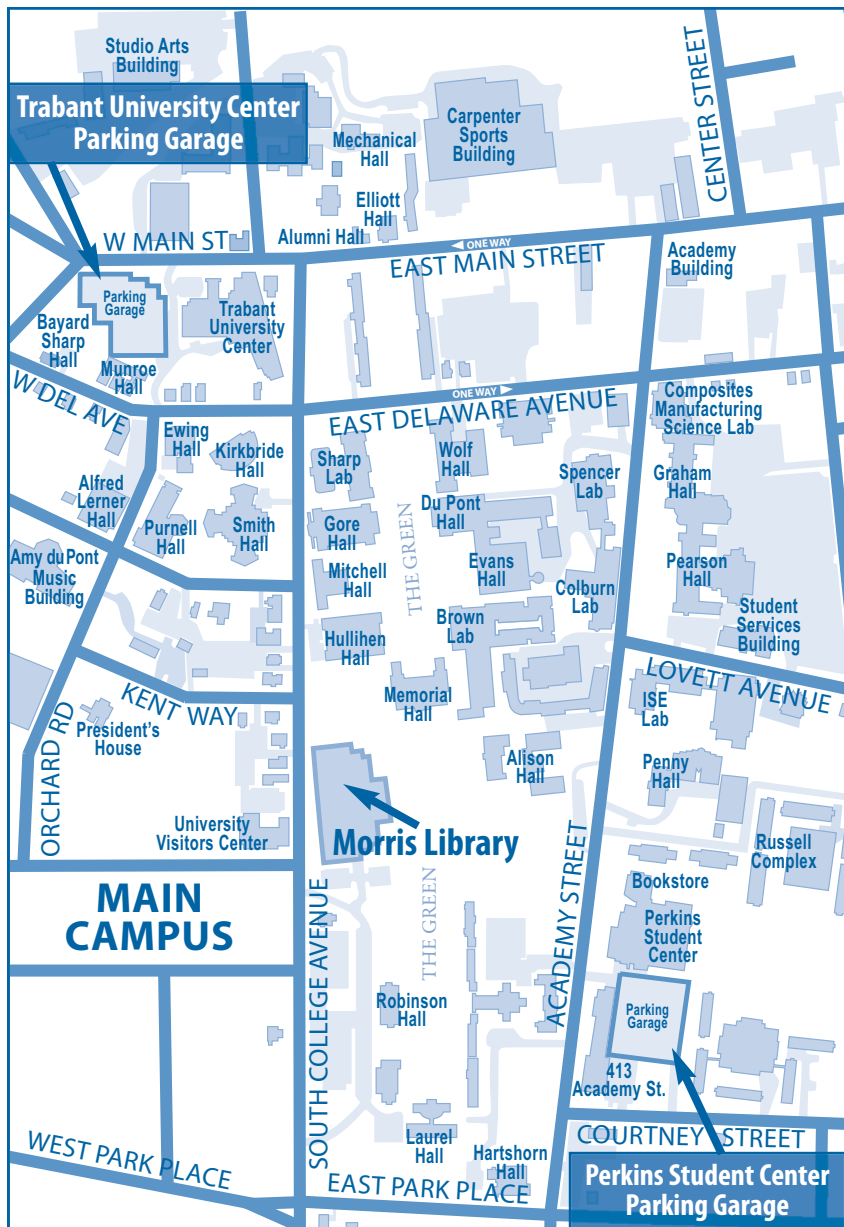
Anne M. Boylan is a historian of the 19th-century United States and of women and gender, and holds a joint appointment as professor with the departments of History and Women and Gender Studies at the University of Delaware. Boylan, a graduate of Mundelein College in Chicago (B.A.) and the University of Wisconsin-Madison (Ph.D.), has been a member of the UD faculty since 1986. She researches American history with emphasis on women, and has extensively studied the history of women's voluntary organizations, as well as the history of women's rights, including reproductive rights, and women's rights movements in the U.S. Her research and teaching interests also include the history of religion in America and historical commemoration.



Boylan has written numerous scholarly articles, reviews and chapters in books. She is the author of *Sunday School: The Formation of an American Institution, 1790-1880* (Yale University Press, 1988); *The Origins of Women's Activism: New York and Boston, 1797-1840* (University of North Carolina Press, 2002); and, most recently, *Women's Rights in the United States: A History in Documents* (Oxford University Press, 2015). She is currently working on a project analyzing popular sources of knowledge about women's history in the era before there was an academic field of women's history.

Among many honors, Boylan has been the recipient of fellowships and awards from the National Endowment for the Humanities, Radcliffe Research Scholars Program, Organization of American Historians, Western Association of Women Historians; American Association for State and Local History and the Middle States Council for Social Studies. She received the inaugural Torch Award for Women's Equality at the University of Delaware in 2012.

Her book, *Women's Rights in the United States*, will be available for purchase for the estimated price of \$22.45 each from the University of Delaware Bookstore both before and after her presentation. The speaker is willing to sign copies of her book during the reception.



Directions to Trabant University Center Garage

From the north: I-95 South to Delaware Exit 1-B, Route 896 North, and continue north on South College Avenue past the Bob Carpenter Sports/Convocation Center, the Delaware Stadium and the Field House until you reach central campus. Continue straight on South College Avenue past the Trabant University Center on the left. Turn left at the light onto Main Street and the Trabant University Center Garage will be on your left and after the Trabant University Center. The Morris Library is located at 181 S. College Avenue and the entrance is on The Green.

From the south: I-95 north to Maryland Exit 109B, Route 279 North (also called Route 2). Proceed on this road, which becomes Elkton Road, into Newark. Turn right onto West Park Place to South College Avenue. Make a left onto South College Avenue, continue on South College Avenue going past the Trabant University Center on the left. Turn left at the light onto Main Street and the Trabant University Center Garage will be on your left and after the Trabant University Center. The Morris Library is located at 181 S. College Avenue and the entrance is on The Green.

Directions to the Perkins Student Center Garage

From the north: I-95 South to Delaware Exit 1-B, Route 896 North, and continue north on South College Avenue past the Bob Carpenter Sports/Convocation Center, the Delaware Stadium, and the Field House until you reach Park Place Road. Turn right onto Park Place Road and then left onto Academy Street. The Perkins Student Center Garage is located at the intersection of Academy and Courtney Streets, adjacent to the Perkins Student Center. The Morris Library is located at 181 S. College Avenue and the entrance is on The Green.

From the south: I-95 North to Maryland Exit 109B, Route 279 North (also called Route 2). Proceed on this road, which becomes Elkton Road, into Newark. Turn right onto West Park Place and follow that road until you come to Academy Street. Make a left onto Academy Street. The Perkins Student Center Garage is located at the intersection of Academy and Courtney Streets, adjacent to the Perkins Student Center. The Morris Library is located at 181 S. College Avenue and the entrance is on The Green.
