

The Morris Library is centrally located on the University of Delaware campus in Newark, Delaware.

Four Libraries

The University of Delaware Library includes the Morris Library where the main collection is housed, two branch libraries located in Newark, Delaware, and a third branch library located in Lewes, Delaware.

- The Morris Library is the main library and is centrally located on the South Green of the University of Delaware campus in Newark, Delaware.
- The **Chemistry Library** is in Room 202 of Brown Laboratory on the central campus of the University of Delaware in Newark, Delaware.
- The Physics Library is in Room 221 of Sharp Laboratory on the central campus of the University of Delaware in Newark, Delaware.
- The Marine Studies Library is in Cannon Laboratory in Lewes, Delaware, approximately 90 miles south of the Newark, Delaware campus.

Borrowing from the Circulating Collection

Students, faculty and staff from Delaware Technical and Community College and Delaware State University may obtain a University of Delaware Library borrower card at no charge by presenting a valid institution identification card and proof of current registration. The University of Delaware Library borrower card and the institution identification card must be presented each time materials are borrowed. Books need to be returned to the library from which they are borrowed. The loan period for most items is 30 days. Overdue fines are charged if materials are returned late.



Computer Access

The Library has more than 200 computers with access to the Internet, library databases and electronic journals. All Library public computers within the Morris Library are accessible to Delaware State University and Delaware Technical and Community College users. There is a fee per page for printing from Library computers. Licensed databases and electronic journals are available on site, but remote access is available only to current University of Delaware students, faculty and staff.

DELCAT Discovery

DELCAT Discovery provides information about and access to the physical and electronic holdings of the University of Delaware Library. DELCAT Discovery provides links to electronic journals, electronic books and other resources. Students can limit searches to only those items physically held by the Library or a search can be done of the entire WorldCat database that encompasses millions of titles in libraries throughout the world. Items held by the University of Delaware Library appear at or near the top of the results display. library.udel.edu

Film and Video Collection

The Film and Video Collection includes more than 26,000 DVDs, Blu-rays, videogames and legacy formats, which may be viewed on site in the Film and Video Collection area on the lower level of the Morris Library, by users with Delaware State University and Delaware Technical and Community College ID cards.
