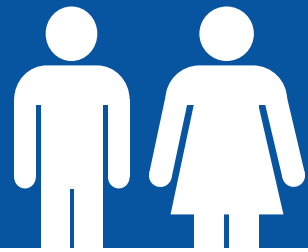

8 THINGS YOU CAN DO AT THE LIBRARY

- 1 Ask a librarian for help with research! Visit the reference desk, schedule a research consultation with a subject librarian, or ask a question electronically via chat, text or email.
- 2 Use the library's website to find print books, e-books, movies, articles and more. If the library doesn't have something you need, you can request it through Interlibrary Loan.
- 3 Find lots of study spaces to work independently or in groups, including reservable study rooms.
- 4 Create multimedia projects at the Student Multimedia Design Center (SMDC) using specialized software and video, audio and lighting equipment.
- 5 View and check out DVDs, Blu-rays, video games and stream videos from the Film and Video Collection.
- 6 Visit Special Collections to explore rare books and manuscripts and view exhibits at the University Museums.
- 7 Access computers throughout the library, including computers with programs to support users with disabilities. The library also provides scanners, photocopiers and printers, including large-format printers.
- 8 Relax and grab a bite to eat in the Library Commons, open 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.
